ENGAGING AND MOTIVATING OUR "MULTIPLE STIMULI GENERATION" FIONA MAUCHLINE Macmillan Education

While most adults are accustomed to text as the main means of receiving and processing information, young people nowadays are far more likely to use other sources. They are, in fact, the Multiple Stimuli Generation and we, as educators, should be taking that into account in our teaching and choice of materials. What's more, teenagers in particular are at a stage of cognitive development where we can alienate rather

than motivate. In this participative plenary, we will look at some of the things going on in the brain that can be overlooked by busy teachers, and we'll try out some activities that will not only support your students and make the classroom a positive place to be but will also generate a lot of language.

Fiona has been in ELT for 30 years and is a teacher, trainer and materials writer. After 28 years in Spain, she relocated to Oxford in autumn 2016. She is the co-author of several courses for secondary education, including 'Motivate' and 'All Clear', for Macmillan Education, and has written materials for several others, including 'Straightforward'. She is also the author of the Macmillan online guide, 'Using Graded Readers in the Classroom'. She has a love of writing, theatre, and photography, but her other passion is teacher development, and she is co-editor of the IATEFL TDSIG e-bulletin. She also tutors on a teacher training course in Devon each summer.

In a world where teens spend hours glued to YouTube, videos are a logical stimulus for language practice. Although ungraded videos can be daunting as listening material, they can be used 'silently' to great effect in other skills lessons. In this workshop, we'll try a handful of engaging activities you can incorporate in lessons to generate

language, learning and fun.

MATTHEW SIEGAL – Cambridge Assessment English ASSESSING WRITING

Writing is a time consuming skill to develop for both students and teachers. One of the issues I had when I started teaching was how to give my students an accurate assessment of their writing skills. In this talk, we will look at how to use the Cambridge Assessment Scale for

writing in order to give your students a better indication as to their level of writing and what they need to develop. We will look at what is being assessed and think about some of the issues we face as teachers when trying to give our students a fair grade.

GIVING FEEDBACK ON WRITING

I have always found giving my students feedback on their writing to be a challenging task. I have often spent a great deal of time putting my thoughts down on the page, only to discover that my students look at their overall mark and then discard the rest. In my second session we will look at some of the issues behind giving our students feedback on their writing that they will really absorb. We will look at some different methods of providing feedback and discuss which ways will be most effective for different students.

Matthew has been teaching English for a number of years and has worked as a teacher in Poland, Laos and the UK. Matthew has worked with Cambridge English Language Assessment since 2015, as a speaker and consultant in Northern and Central Europe. He also works as a Director of Studies of a summer language school in the United Kingdom. He spent a number of years working as a Senior Teacher and In-house Teacher Trainer at International House, Katowice. He has delivered training sessions to teaching professionals from a range of institutions who deal with students from a variety of countries and backgrounds.

STEPPING INTO THE REAL WORLD: TRANSITIONING LISTENING

"I've studied English for years, but I can't understand anyone!" This is a common complaint from students arriving in the UK. This workshop aims to introduce you to practical activities and materials you can use to help students transition from understanding scripted listening materials to feeling comfortable with real-world English.

Sandy Millin is the Director of Studies at IH Bydgoszcz, Poland, having started her career in Brno. Her very first conference presentation was at the P.A.R.K. Conference and she has learnt a lot from the many great speakers she's seen there over the years. Her teaching experience ranges from young learners to adults of all language levels and competences, and her teacher training experience covers training on the Trinity Cert TESOL and Exam Assessors Courses. Do your students often reach for their phones to search for the meaning of unknown words, wondering which definition to choose? A pinch of theory and a huge peck of practice is needed so that students can enrich their speaking experience.

BUSINESS ENGLISH – TEACHING IS NOT ENOUGH!

When we get down to business, vocabulary and grammar, listening and speaking skills are essential but not enough. They must be combined with business skills such as participating in meetings, giving presentations or negotiations. Task-based learning and role play are effective techniques to 'put it all together'. First and foremost, the teacher needs to set a task and create a safe environment for students to

practise business skills in class and then provide genuine feedback on their performance. In this workshop, we will explore these techniques and do our best to get the best deal.

Navot was born in Israel to an English speaking family. He studied English at Haifa University and Masarykova Univerzita in Brno. Teaching English in Israel, Japan and the Czech Republic, he has taught in almost every English teaching sphere: from CEOs to kindergarten kids, from individual courses to state schools and from relaxed conversation lessons to demanding exam preparation courses. Navot is interested in language acquisition and developing student's learning habits. Currently he teaches business and technical English at a machining company as wells as at an elementary school in Olomouc.

TRANSLATION ACTIVITIES: TRIUMPH OR TROUBLE?

This continues to be one of the more polarizing issues in ELT. Should translation, which used to be a very important feature of language instruction, make a full comeback? Or should it be consigned to the dustbin of history forever?

In this workshop, I'm going to share with you a number of translation activities which, I felt, worked well in my classes. Come to my session, and see if these might work for yours, too!

Louel has been teaching a wide range of courses for adults (medical English, business English, Cambridge exams preparation courses, conversation, etc.) in Brno since 2008 and has taught students coming from more than 25 countries. He has also done workshops and seminars not only in the Czech Republic but also in Slovakia, Croatia, Bulgaria, Ireland, and the Philippines. His areas of interests include Dogme, English as a Lingua Franca, native-speakerism, and ESP. He always makes it a point to teach culture in the classroom and has made it his mission to make his students fall in love with learning words.

TEACHING TEENS – A BOX OF CHOCOLATES?

Teenage classes are like a box of chocolates: you never know what you're going to get! Sometimes we have the most wonderful lessons with our teens, and at other times, despite hours of preparation creating fantastic tasks and activities, the lesson flops. The question is: how we can work with, rather than against this particular age group?

This session begins by questioning whether the mindset of teachers and learners can affect the learning process. We will look at a variety of ways to motivate and engage learners, whilst helping them increase their autonomy along the way. Hopefully, by exploring the above, we'll be able to walk into the classroom better equipped to enjoy all the chocolates in the box.

Nikki Fořtová has been involved in ELT since 2002. She is CELTA and DELTA qualified and holds an MA in Applied Linguistics and TESOL. Nikki is a CELTA tutor, an oral examiner for the Cambridge suite of exams and an Oxford Teachers' Academy trainer. Nikki has run practical methodology training sessions and workshops around Europe to English language teachers and is particularly interested in the application of technology to teaching and learning. As well as helping to maintain several online teacher training sites, she has designed and tutored online and face-to-face ICT courses for English language teachers. Her main area of research and interest lies in helping learners to develop their speaking skills in an asynchronous online environment. Originally from the UK, Nikki is a teacher and teacher trainer at a university in the Czech Republic.

MICHAELA TILTON – Teacher/ Trainer BUILDING THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE LEARNER'S BRAIN

Despite educators' best efforts to teach English as quickly and effectively as possible, many students never develop academic English fluency. In this presentation, we will discuss the latest research on the English language learner's brain, reasons why English acquisition is slow, and how effective technological adjuncts can build the English brain, quickly and effectively, moving students towards proficiency

faster.

Michaela Tilton received her Master's degree from the University of California in Los Angeles (UCLA) and has worked at various high-technology and communications companies. In 2006 she relocated from the United States to the Czech Republic and has been managing and developing programs focused on learning and brain development, specializing in early childhood development. Her most recent objective has been researching and implementing programs with proven scientific methods of English language learning. Her primary focus is neuroscience-based programs for English learning developed by the scientists at Scientific Learning.

FANTASTIC ENGLISH WORDS ABOUT CZECH CULTURE...AND HOW TO TEACH THEM!

Do you know the term for a pub that brews beer on its premises? And if this watering hole was shabby and dirty and reeked of cigarette smoke, would you know what to call it? What's one word for "food and snacks eaten with alcoholic drinks"? How do you say "na ex" in English? And if a

stamgast told you he moonlighted as a moonshiner, would you know what he was talking about?

Over the years, I've managed to compile a smorgasbord of vocabulary you're unlikely to find in coursebooks but which I've observed students tend to need when they talk about their way of life. How can we teach these lexical items effectively? How can we help our learners become not only competent users of the English language but also successful communicators of Czech culture?



MARK ANDREWS – SOL

CHANGES IN THE ENGLISH LANGUAGE AND THE IMPLICATIONS FOR LANGUAGE TEACHINIG

English is constantly evolving, and, as language teachers, we are confronted with how we

respond to those changes in the classroom. In this session I will look at some of these changes and suggest ways of discussing these changes with students which may help them to be more aware of how English

is used and make them more effective listeners and producers of language themselves.

Mark Andrews worked as a teacher trainer in Hungary for 15 years, before that he was in the German Democratic Republic, Czechoslovakia and the Czech Republic. He's been living and working in Central/Eastern Europe for 35 years, 12 of which were as ELT methodology teacher and advisor with the British Council. He was involved in a project with resulted in the text book for teenagers "Zoom In", was coordinator of the IATEFL Hungary Culture and Literature Special Interest Group for 5 years and is a big supporter of IATEFL affiliated associations in the Central and Eastern European region. He now works for SOL (Sharing One Language) in Devon as a teacher trainer, teacher on student courses and course and materials developer.

FORMATIVE ASSESSMENT – A PROCESS RATHER THAN A TOOL

This seminar examines the formative function of assessment assessment for learning and the self-development of learners, which complements the basic summative function of assessment. This new trend in education puts emphases on self-check and the selfassessment of learners and helps them become independent and responsible for their process of learning. Learners become owners of

their learning while teachers play the role of tutors and facilitators of learning, providing students with information and tools they need to master English language.

Danka studied English and French at Charles University. She has 11 years of work experience in teaching English and French, and has taught wide variety of courses from preschool children's courses to individual and group in-company courses. She has also worked as a language auditor and prepared and presented methodology workshops for fellow teachers. She has recently joined Bohemian Ventures as a methodological consultant and is eager to share her knowledge and experience with other teachers.



MAT SMITH – Oxford University Press USING YOUR COURSEBOOK FOR MIXED LEVELS

Most of us use a coursebook in most of our classes. Our coursebook is designed to teach a specific level of student, but we often have a mixed-level class. In this session, we will look at how to differentiate coursebook activities to provide differing levels of challenge within our classes while still having all students working towards the same goal.

Matthew (Mat) Smith is an English teacher and teacher trainer from Southend in Essex. He has been teaching English since 2004 and has worked in the Czech Republic, Spain, Turkey and England. DENISA PETRILAKOVÁ – Teacher/ Trainer CONTEXTUAL LEARNING AND DISCOURSE IN TEFL

Learners have more autonomy and exposure to authentic materials than ever before. This session examines language courses for B2-C1 learners focussing on the shift from 'teaching' to 'facilitated acquisition'.

Contextual Learning could be seen as an example of how a general learning mechanism such as inductive reasoning is required for both second and first language acquisition. Textbooks will neither suffice nor work. The only thing that works is a consistent study together with real-life situations to create learning. The challenge is to stop focussing on grammar, gap-fills, multiple-choice activities and stand alone sentences, and start looking at the entire discourse.

ON FIRE OR BURNT OUT? NIKKI FOŘTOVÁ Oxford University Press

Teaching is one of the most rewarding professions on the planet but at the same time it can be exhausting. Twin the stress of the demands placed on us by students, parents and institutions with our desire to give 100%, and we may find ourselves hurtling towards Burnout Syndrome before we even realise it.

This talk considers why teachers suffer from burnout, goes on to identify some of the tell-tale signs of the syndrome and how we can recognise its onset, before offering some practical ideas that we can implement to stop and refuel in time to make sure we're on fire in the classroom and not burnt out.

Nikki Fořtová has been involved in ELT since 2002. She is CELTA and DELTA qualified and holds an MA in Applied Linguistics and TESOL. Nikki is a CELTA tutor, an oral examiner for the Cambridge suite of exams and an Oxford Teachers' Academy trainer.
